This month, they'll cover several new federal initiatives expanding access to clean energy jobs being led by the Departments of Energy and Labor.

Funding / Support Opportunities

One Million Black Women: Black in Business

This free, 10-week business education program through Goldman-Sachs focuses on Black women sole proprietors. Participants receive a \$2,000 program stipend, all-expense trips paid to Goldman-Sachs in NYC, and access to a powerful network of Black women entrepreneurs and strategic advisors. Participants can expect to learn how to scale a profitable business, effectively price products and services, develop a business action plan, meet with advisors, mentors, and other business leaders, and more! **Apply by April 21.**

Clean Energy to Communities Program: In-Depth Partnerships

Through the DOE Clean Energy to Communities (C2C) program, NREL offers in-depth technical partnerships that support communities in developing secure, reliable, resilient, and affordable clean energy systems. These partnerships offer teams—composed of local government, community-based organizations, utilities, and other key organizations—the chance to work alongside national laboratory staff as they apply robust modeling and analysis tools and conduct hardware-in-the-loop testing of solutions adapted to the community's unique

conditions and contexts. Winning teams will receive \$500k to \$3 million in subcontract funding and \$1.5 - \$3 million in technical assistance. **Apply by May 17.**

Rural Energy For America Program (REAP)

The REAP program provides guaranteed loan financing and grant funding to agricultural producers and rural small businesses for renewable energy systems or to make energy efficiency improvements. With the passage of the IRA, REAP has been provided over \$2B for renewable energy systems and energy efficiency improvement grants through 2031. Rural Development is now accepting applications for the first of six quarterly competitions, with application deadlines on:

- June 30, 2023
- September 30, 2023
- December 31, 2023
- March 31, 2024
- June 30, 2024
- September 30, 2024
