July 19-20: Clean Energy Jobs & Workforce Workshop (Los Angeles, CA)



Green Power Venture's Pilot-2-Profit

Deadline: July 18

<u>Green Power Venture's</u> Pilot-2-Profit brings together people and organizations in the climatetech industry. It serves as a platform for showcasing groundbreaking ideas, revolutionary solutions, and disruptive innovations that have the potential to shape the future of the industry. You'll receive the opportunity to pilot your technology, receive training on customer engagement, get a chance to pitch to cleantech Venture Capitalists, bid on jobs through a reverse pitch contest, network with over 50 African American cleantech founders, and attend GPV's Annual Convention - The ACRRE Initiative. Pitch competition winners can receive between \$1,000-\$5,000.



Transitioning Tribal Colleges and Universities to Clean Energy

Deadline: July 27

The DOE Office of Indian Energy Policy and Programs is soliciting applications from Tribal Colleges and Universities (TCUs) to install clean energy technologies at TCUs. The DOE Office of Indian Energy is soliciting applications for clean energy project and curriculum planning (Topic Area 1); and clean energy technology and curriculum deployment (Topic Area 2).

Women-Owned Small Business Federal Contract program

The WOSB Program helps provide a level playing field for women business owners. The federal government limits competition for certain contracts to businesses that participate in the WOSB Program. These contracts are specific industries where WOSBs are underrepresented. Some contracts are restricted further to economically disadvantaged women-owned small businesses.

Energy Improvements in Rural or Remote Areas (ERA) Program

Deadline: October 12

The ERA program is soliciting applications for \$500K-\$5M awards to support energy projects that will improve the resilience, safety, reliability, availability, and environmental performance of energy systems in rural or remote areas. Pre-applications are due on July 13. NREL, on OCED's behalf, will be providing no-cost technical assistance to communities and organizations interested in the program.
